THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have practiced out numbers and used our fingers to add two numbers. We have looked at some dinosaur poetry with rhyming words in and practiced finding rhyming words of our own. We have used musical instruments, listening to the sounds and creating sounds that dinosaurs could move to.

Class 2 – Class 2 have worked very hard this week and are only four marbles away from a Marble Jar treat. Hopefully I will be sending a note home informing you it will be an afternoon next week. In English the children have written their final recount and moved on to starting to look at instructions. In maths they are working on fractions of amounts and numbers. Thank you for all the shoe boxes; we have enough now to make our aquariums after half term.

Class 3 – In maths we investigated square and Fibonacci numbers, some children also looked at triangular numbers. We have also moved onto arrays and looked at linked discussion and multiplication facts. In English we finished our imaginary explorations. The children enjoyed researching and presenting their learning about the history of chocolate, death, war and spicy chillies.

Class 4 – This week in class 4 the maths learning has focused on calculating the equivalent percentage of a fraction and rounding a decimal answer to one decimal place. We have also been working on improving our understanding of mathematical language. In English we are continuing with our class book Wolf Brother which the children are enjoying immensely. The children have completed their 500 word short stories and they will now be sent off to the BBC radio 2 short story competition. As part of our Bones and Stones topic the children have been making models of Mesolithic houses. Researching the materials they would have been made from and how they constructed.
