## THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

**Class 1** – This week in Class 1 we read some different postcards and wrote a class post card about the best day ever (we got to stay up late and watch the football). We have also looked at money, learning that there are different coins other than just 1p and adding the coins together. We also looked at the types of creatures that you can find at the beach and drew and labelled our favourite.

**Class 2** – This week Class 2 have been planning their own Australian Tradition Tales, inspired by those we have read and our topic work about the Aboriginal culture. In maths we have been using arrays and pictorial representations to help with multiplication and division. The noisiest lesson of the week had to be bingo with animal names in French!

**Class 3** – In class 3 this week we wrote some really interesting dialogue, correctly punctuated with adverbials and different said synonyms. We also had to carefully analyse and edit a difficult text about Wimbledon. In our topic we looked at correct arranging on Anglo-Saxon timeline before investigating the Viking attack on Lindesfarne and a Viking country and city house. We enjoyed looking at underarm and overarm throwing in PE and measuring a short track to run a mile.

**Class 4** – Another very busy week again in class 4. The year 5 children went to Axe Valley Academy for a sports science themed STEM day. Eleven of the year 5's also went on play leader training at Colyton Grammar school. Year 6 have also been out of school at the Life Skills training sessions. We have also had a transition day in school with the Yr6's where we talked and thought about secondary school and all the pros and cons of the changes ahead of them. The children have continued to work on their adverts and have enjoyed maths investigations linked to the World Cup.
