THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we remembered the story 'The Not So Boring Day' and created our own version with animals that we would like to find in our house. We also read 'Tadpole's Promise' and used it as a starting point for talking about changes the class have experienced. We also worked together as a class to rewrite the ending. We have looked at number formation in Maths and adding on 1 or 2 using blocks and our fingers to support us. In P.E. we thought about movements to show how animals and plants change and move as they grow.

Class 2 – In Class 2 this week we have been continuing our work on measures in maths by reading different scales for weight, capacity and temperature.

In English the children wrote their final set of instructions and we have started to look at humorous stories, with inspiration coming from Traction Man by Mini Grey. Our elicitation task involved telling funny stories about our adventures in the snow; clearly adventures the children thoroughly enjoyed.

Class 3 – We have started to read Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The children have put themselves in Charlie's shoes and described their emotions as they stare longingly at the chocolate factory. In maths we have measured many things in mm and cm and corrected between the two. We researched a famous Mr Cadbury and then wrote a biography as well as trying a basic chocolate to think about our future class recipe's.

Class 4 – This week in class 4 we have been looking at the bus stop method of division and formal long division which we progressed into multiple step word problems. In English we learnt how to write a recount and looked at the genre features of a newspaper. We also started writing our own newspapers. In topic work, we made our own Mesolithic weapons and designed a Mesolithic menu.
