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THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have been measuring things, we have been outside looking for Autumn leaves and comparing them to find if they are longer or shorter. We have re-read our stories 'It's a Secret' and 'The Magic Bed' and we wrote our own class story where we could go anywhere we liked (we went to an undersea world). In PE we pretended we were characters from our stories and had to tip-toe and pretend we were being chased. We have also got all of our marbles and so are due a marble treat next week (We will send out a letter detailing the day and what the children can bring early next week).

Class 2 – In Class 2 the children have been writing their own list poems this week based on Ten Things Found in a Wizard's Pocket. Maths has been addition and subtraction using number lines for Year 1s and adding and subtracting 9 and 11 for Year 2s. In science we investigated the absorbency of different cleaning cloths and paper towels and in topic we investigated the question 'How did the buildings help the Great Fire of London spread?' We have even dared to start thinking about Christmas in RE!

Class 3 – In English we've looked at the difference between compound and complex sentences. Some found this challenging especially with the terminology such as conjunctions and subordinate clauses. In maths we have completed lots of word problems involving bar models, subtraction and addition. In science we looked at muscles, how they work in pairs and we investigated the questions 'Are more active people stronger'. Our results strangely indicated this wasn't the case!!! This led to some interesting conversations. In our topic, Pole to Pole, we looked at the history of polar exploration and put key dates/events on a timeline.

Class 4 – This week in Maths we worked on multi-step word problems and in English we wrote our own instructions. On Thursday morning Class 4 had a science outreach session run by the Ogden Trust through Colyton Grammar school. The children all thoroughly enjoyed this.

Class 4 Super Science Session

Class 4 had an exciting super science session on Thursday morning. We were fortunate to be joined by Dr Usher, Mr Lynch and Ben (a 6th form student) for a 'Mysterious Materials' lesson. Dr Usher introduced us to hydrogel by showing us an amazing magic trick before we go to make our own. It looked like an ice block with sugar on top! Next we played with polymorph. Ben heated the polymorph for us that turned it into a mouldable putty but we had to shape it quickly before it turned into a solid! Our third mysterious material was ooblek. It is made from corn flower and water. It is a bit of a strange material because it moves like a liquid but acts like a solid. Our final material was thermochromic ink which disappears like magic when heated. However, when you put the paper in the freezer, the ink magically re-appears! We had a really fun and exciting morning and would love to welcome them back again.
