THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 - This week in Class 1 we have read some different versions of The Three Little Pigs. We have created a display for the book showing the different building materials and we all enjoyed joining in with the famous lines that the wolf says. We practiced following instructions, pretending we were sailing a boat in PE and we also improved our careful balance with an egg and spoon challenge and a football challenge. In Maths we played a doubling game, racing to build identical towers and showing the amounts on each hand.

Class 2 – A short week has seen some revision for year 2 and practise SATs papers. We have also been looking at time in maths; it was amazing how long 5 minutes felt when asked to run round the field for that length of time! In English the children have written some super acrostic poems for SEASIDE, using inspiration from the many children who went to the beach at the weekend. Long may the sun continue!

Class 3 – We have added and subtracted fractions in maths, learning to keep the denomination the same. In English we have written diaries in the 1st person and described Willy Wonka. We enjoyed looking at seed wind dispersal in science and completing an investigation into sycamore seeds by making different paper helicopters.

Class 4 – This week in class 4, the Year 6's have been working very hard preparing for their SAT's. We have been working on decimals, percentages and fractions in maths. In English the Year 5's have looked at the features of poetry and have started to write their monster poems.

Promoting Independence

This term we are going to try really hard to encourage the children's independence.

We would like the children to line up with their class and carry their own book bag and coats into school. The children will continue to be walked in by their class teacher and staff are on hand if a child needs any extra help during the transitional period.

Developing children's independence and confidence needs to be nurtured from a young age and is important in allowing children to learn to do things for themselves as it includes making decisions and taking on responsibility.

These are hugely important skills for children to learn to cope with in adulthood. Helping children to become independent is seen as so important that it is a focus of the Foundation Stage curriculum in England. Additionally, from a fire risk perspective, if children have walked in with their teacher or been dropped at the office if they are late, then in the event of a fire, our register is accurate and we know exactly who should be accounted for. 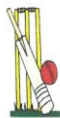
