THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week Class 1 we revisited the book 'The Sand Horse' and read 'Melrose and Croc' which was about a grumpy crocodile that gets taken to the beach. We have also used the water tray in investigate capacity, guessing which container holds the most, how many cups we can fill and how we know which has the most. We also had a mini practice sports day in P.E. practicing the skills ready to show off on the day. We looked at the different ways that you can travel to the beach and wrote a list of things that we like to take with us.

Class 2 – This week in Class 2 we have been looking at Australian traditional tales and sequencing the story of The Rainbow Bird. Maths has been back to basics of place value, ordering numbers and placing them on blank number lines. In PE we have started preparing for the all-important Sports Day and in science we have thought carefully about what we use plants for.

Class 3 – We have enjoyed exploring sound in science, looking at what sound is? At how we can change the pitch and amplitude of musical instruments and how ear shape and position help hearing. We also made some ear cones and tested whose were the best. In maths we further explored tenths and hundredths in fractions and decimals and worked at dividing by 10 and 100.

Class 4 – This week in class 4 we have completed a number and place value challenge. In English we have looked at features that make a great advert. We then started to write our own adverts in preparation for advertising our young entrepreneur products.

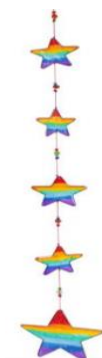
Values Certificates & Learning Behaviour Certificates:

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Goren Festival, Stockland - 29th June - 1st July 2018

We are organising a family friendly, nature and music festival in Stockland at the end of June. It is set on a 70 acre wildflower farm of meadows, woodlands and streams and various wildlife organisations will be coming along to do presentations on the Saturday morning and lead nature tours, bat walks, moth trapping etc through the meadows. There will be loads of nature based children's activities and workshops, mown paths through the meadows, a bar, camping, artisan street food vendors and trade stands, as well as 15 live bands playing on stage in the barn. The festival runs from 29th June to 1st July and tickets are only available online via the website: www.goren.co.uk/festival - Adults only £30 for the weekend and children only £6.
