THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1: This week in Class 1 we showed how much we could remember about the story Dogger and wrote about the toy dog in the story. We also acted out all the parts of the story The Monster and the Teddy Bear, took photos and got the class to guess which characters the children were playing. We have practiced our counting and adding on in Maths and thought about helping in R.E. and made up a class song.

Class 2: It has been a very busy last week in Class 2. In English the children have written their own Enormous Egg stories. They planned their story using picture story boards and key phrases. Once they had completed these they went on to write their stories. We have been continuing our work on fractions in our maths lessons. Year 2 have been solving fraction word problems while Year 1 have been solving fractions of amounts. They have continued to really enjoy their topic work and they have researched and drawn a time line on the life of Mary Anning. They also wrote a newspaper report where they pretended to interview Mary Anning about finding fossils.

Class 3: This week in English, Class 3 have written our own 'Escape from Pompeii' stories, thinking carefully about adding lots of descriptive detail. We have typed the stories up using Word and created some artwork using watercolours or oil pastels. In Maths, we have continued to look at measurement by converting and comparing measurements in cm and m; and m and km. In Science, we conducted an experiment to investigate the permeability of soils taken from our gardens. We were interested that some of the permeability of the soils in Smallridge were very different! In Topic, we looked at the Roman invasion attempts on 'Britannia' and pretended that we were Celts, weighing up the pros and cons of having the Romans conquer our country! For homework over the half term, Mrs Gabb will be sending out the usual Maths and spelling activities. We would also like the children to access Spelling and Maths Shed to practise their spellings and complete the Maths assignments that we have set them. We hope that you have a restful half term.

Class 4: We completed a short non-fiction block of work in English looking at Charles Dickens. The children, after inferring about him from a £10 note, researched the great writer, producing timelines, answering questions and making a wordle. In pairs they then made an A3 sized non-chronological report about his life and works. In maths we looked at ordering fractions and placing on number lines where the denominators are both different or the same.

Super 6 - Beatrice Patterson-Stack

Bea has been close to earning her Super 6 for a while but had a few targets to work on. She has really increased the amount she reads daily and has really developed her independence towards her own learning, knowing when to seek help and when to have the confidence to give things a go and draw on her own knowledge. Throughout the year Bea has been a great role model, helping out younger children at break times and supporting them in assemblies. Congratulations Bea.
