## THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

**Class 1** - This week in Class 1 we have read the stories Tadpole's Promise and The Very Hungry Caterpillar, we thought about how we would like to change the stories. As a class we re-wrote the end to Tadpoles Promise to make it a happier ending. We also all planted bulbs in our outside area and read Jasper's Beanstalk to see what Jasper does correctly to look after his plant and what he does wrong. We used our R.E lesson to inspire our art work which we will show at the Easter Service.

**Class 2** – Yet again I have been really impressed with the work, effort and enthusiasm that the children have put in this week; I am very proud of all of them. In maths we are moving back to addition and subtraction, looking at working out missing numbers in calculations. They have been enjoying Traction Man in English; writing descriptions of characters and beginning to draw story pathways. In topic they have all produced some super posters about the water cycle. We are all enjoying watching the tadpoles grow in the tank. Will they have back legs by the time we return on Monday

**Class 3** – The children have really enjoyed continuing Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and completing English work linked to the book. They have designed some fantastic questions to ask people about the closure of the factory as well as some great complex sentences with prepositions to explain reasons both for and against the closure of the chocolate factory. In maths we have continued to convert mm, cm, m and km, order different lengths and complete measurement investigations and word problems. The children really enjoyed using water colours to paint flowers in the style of Georgia O'Keefe as well as exploring the Rainforest and the problems of deforestation, linking it back to our chocolate work.

**Class 4** - This week in class 4 we have continued writing our newspapers. We looked at direct and indirect speech and have incorporated this into our newspaper articles. In RE we looked at the symbols that represent Easter and in Maths we continued looking at division and word problems.

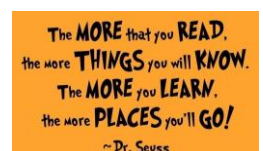
## Wordsearch – Book Voucher draw
