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## THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

**Class 1** – This week we imagined what it might be like if we were at a magical school, we thought about what rules they would need in their schools and we thought up some magic words. In Maths we practiced matching our numerals to numbers on dice and we built models with a certain numbers of bricks. We looked at the changing weather in Autumn and how we change our clothes when it gets cold, we also played games in PE where we had to collect spells and cast spells which involved running and throwing skills.

**Class 2** – We got rather messy this week trying our hand at making a small wattle and daub wall! It was also very frustrating and made us appreciate how difficult it would have been to build houses back in 1666 at the time of the Great Fire of London. In English we have started work on information texts by looking at alphabetical order and sorting words. We then came up with a list of the facts we thought we already knew about sharks, which we will be researching next week. In maths we have been counting in steps of 2 and multiples of 2, beginning to appreciate multiplication. In science the children investigated whether they could waterproof paper by applying wax crayon to it.

**Class 3** – In Maths the children have completed lots of work involving traditional column subtraction. Most have progressed from no borrowing or exchanging up to 2 or 3 step subtraction word problems. In English the children wrote a detailed personal recount about an event in their lives before looking at the Antarctic's expeditions of Scott and Shackleton and writing questions and recounts about their adventures. In science they investigated forces, pushing and pulling and completed some experiments with ramps, carpets and cars. In art they created some polar landscapes with pencils and ripped paper.

**Class 4** – In Maths this week we have been using our reasoning and problem solving skills. In English we have been looking at chronological reports (recount). We have finished building our rockets and did a successful test launch in the playground.

### Class 4 Super Science Session

Class 4 had an exciting super science session on Thursday morning. We were fortunate to be joined by Dr Usher, Mr Lynch and Ben (a 6<sup>th</sup> form student) for a 'Mysterious Materials' lesson. Dr Usher introduced us to hydrogel by showing us an amazing magic trick before we go to make our own. It looked like an ice block with sugar on top! Next we played with polymorph. Ben heated the polymorph for us that turned it into a mouldable putty but we had to shape it quickly before it turned into a solid! Our third mysterious material was ooblek. It is made from corn flower and water. It is a bit of a strange material because it moves like a liquid but acts like a solid. Our final material was thermochromic ink which disappears like magic when heated. However, when you put the paper in the freezer, the ink magically re-appears! We had a really fun and exciting morning and would love to welcome them back again.
