In an act of worship this week we celebrated children who have continued to try really hard with their reading, children who are regularly reading and quizzing well with accelerated reader to show they have understood what they have read.

The following children received the following stars,

Silver - Ellie and Sascha in Class 2 and Benjamin and Max in Class 4

This now means that with a term to go 25 children have a star but there is still plenty of time for other children to read regularly and earn their own stars.

The Children's Week

Class 1 - This week in Class 1 we have started our new topic of Journeys. We start this topic where we start most of our journeys, home. We have read the story Home and looked at the difference between a house and a home, we also wrote about what we like to do in our homes. We also had a visit from a story teller who told the story the Twits in a very lively way.

Class 2 – Wow - sun! The large umbrella is up in our outside area, the back door is wide open, hot, sweaty children, everybody smiling and Mrs Perratt nagging about sunhats, sun cream and water; spring has arrived in Class 2. Workwise this week we have continued some work in English inspired by Traction Man and undertaken addition and subtraction in maths. We have started our science work on plants and our topic work exploring Australia. Instead of a weekly Learning Log I have asked the children to do a project this half term and I sent them home with information about it on Thursday, please talk to them about it.

Class 3 – The children of class 3 have settled back really well and have worked hard right from the start. In Maths we have continued to explore fractions of amounts and shapes and we looked at the different ways an object can be equally divided and the fractions this generated. In English the children explored direct speech, linked to characters from Charlie and the Chocolate factory. All of the children, after a proper hand wash, all made some chocolate, which they have promoted across to school to then sell.

Class 4 – This week in maths we have been looking at Roman numerals. We have also completed some maths SATs past papers. In English we have done some reading comprehension and the Year 6's have looked in depth at present simple, past progressive, present perfect, past simple, past progressive, past perfect and future simple tenses. I'm sure the Year 6 children will be happy to explain what the differences are! We have also designed our one pot menus and priced up our ingredients.
