## THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

**Class 1** - This week in Class 1 we have looked at the books 'Don't let the Pigeon Drive the Bus' and 'Don't let the Pigeon Stay Up Late'. We then thought about rules that we have in the classroom. We have been looking at numbers and trying to teach Teddington (the class teddy) to recognise his numbers to 10. We have also changed into our plimsolls and been over to the hall for P.E. Next week we will get changed into P.E. kit to do our P.E. Can you please make sure that everything that comes into school is labelled.

**Class 2** – This week Class 2 have continued learning about adjectives by looking at pictures and describing what they could see. The children produced some really impressive silhouette pictures this week as part of our topic on 'The Great Fire of London'.

**Class 3** – In Class 3 we have had a busy week. In English we have planned and written our own poem based on 'How to be a pirate' by David Harmer. I was very impressed with the adjective choices and neat handwriting. In maths we have continued to look at place value and explored what numbers are made from. In Science the children have started to explore nutrition.

**Class 4** – In class 4 this week we have been consolidating our knowledge of division with remainders. We have carried on with our creative writing and written some fantastic stories – some of them were very atmospheric and spooky! Now that the school has moved on to Accelerated Reader, we have seen the children challenge themselves by reading a wide range of books. Just a reminder that homework goes out on a Friday and needs to be handed in the following Friday. Staff are always available in the morning to have a quick chat to talk about any homework issues.

## Mindfulness Club

Hello, my name is Jenny Lidster and I have trained to teach mindfulness with the Mindfulness in Schools Project and Mindful Schools. In its simplest form Mindfulness is learning to pay attention in the present moment, and research studies have shown it can help with boosting self esteem, coping with stress and anxiety, getting to sleep more easily, emotional self-regulation, compassion, concentration and a sense of wellbeing.

In the sessions the children will learn; what mindfulness is and how it can help us, how to focus on the present moment, ways to improve concentration skills, what is happening when we feel difficult emotions, ways to handle those emotions, how to bring about feelings of calm and relaxation and self compassion and positivity.

The sessions are designed to be fun and relaxed and will include a mixture of breathing and mindfulness techniques, movement, mindful activities, games and crafts, positive self talk and affirmations, and guided visualisations.

The cost of a 30 minute weekly session is £4.50 per child.
