THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have read the story 'Rover' which is told from the point of view of a pet. We had great fun trying to think like a pet, what we would order our humans to do, what things would we find strange (what does a dog think a toilet or a Hoover is for?) We have also looked closely at our numbers up to 20, practicing writing our numbers and counting on or back. It is a good time to play board games like snakes and ladders! We looked at how close the nearest beach is to the school and we looked at the directions North, South, East and West for the first time.

Class 2 – It has been lovely to have Class 2 enlarged this week on Tuesday morning and Thursday afternoon with the year 1s from Class 1; we have all had a great time. In English we have continued looking at Australian traditional tales and started thinking of ideas to create our own. Maths has been addition and subtraction. The Australian theme has continued in art work with some super painted backgrounds overlaid with felt pen detailed patterns in an Aboriginal style. In PE we have continued practising for Sports Day.

Class 3 – We started looking at what 'Genre' means in English and the common elements of all stories. The children over the next few weeks will plan and write a genre specific story using the book 'Story Path' to help them. We have ordered, written and compared decimals and fractions in maths. In science the children planned and carried out an experiment to see which materials best muffle sound.

Class 4 – This week in class 4 we have had our end of year maths assessments and have conducted some maths investigations. In English we have looked at descriptive story writing based on an image the children had chosen. We have also continued working on our 'Young Entrepreneur' projects which are taking shape and looking great.
