THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have enjoyed an old poem called The House that Jack Built. The children in year 1 did a performance of the poem while the reception groups found things from the classroom to create a picture book. In Maths we continued to look at money, finding things from the classroom to add to our shop and making price labels for them. We also looked at subtraction, counting back in 1 or 2 numbers. We have also shared the story of the Gingerbread Man and linked this to lots of activities, including “chasing” paint around a page by blowing straws.

Class 2 – Wow! So much hard work this week from both year 1 and 2. The year 2s have been amazing, undertaking their SATs with great confidence and concentration and all tried their very hardest. The year 1s, meanwhile, wrote some super stories based on Handa's Surprise and undertook some maths challenge questions. It was with great pleasure that I sat back and watched their presentations in the afternoons about countries they had chosen. Every child stood up and presented their work with confidence and authority. They had clearly researched their countries well and found out some fascinating facts. Well done Class 2.

Class 3 – Please see the write up below about their residential trip to Adventure Okehampton.

Class 4 – For most of the week the children have been enjoying their residential/activity days. The Year 6 have had a go at sailing, rafting, windsurfing, kayaking and paddleboarding whilst the year 5's have visited RAMM and clip n climb and had a go at bush craft and toasting marshmallows. It is a great way for them to end this half term and it has been great to see the children overcoming their worries and encouraging others. Well done!

Class 3 Residential

I would hope that all of the children agree that our residential trip to Okehampton was really successful, challenging and fun. To start with, it was great that nearly all of the children came and took part in all of the activities. I especially enjoyed seeing them making up their own games and playing so nicely in the local park during our 'free time'.

The children took turns participating in three activities.

1. Climbing wall – Some children are natural 'spider people' and zoomed up, down and across the climbing wall many times. Others were very nervous, but when encouraged by the instructors and each other, they tried to climb and challenged themselves to climb higher with each attempt.

2. Archery – I was surprised to learn that I had 'women's arms', my arm was hyper extending and this resulted in the bow twanging my forearm. We played many different archery games. The children told a story by hitting different targets and each of them, independently, had Donald Trump as the bad guy!

3. Team Building & Low Ropes – I always find team building fascinating, watching how children communicate with each other, the loud and quiet voices and those children that came up with original ideas. One group ended up with a few dominant personalities and it was great seeing how over time they learnt to cooperate and listen to each other.

Everyone slept really well, there were a few tears but a lot less than I expected. Class 3 shared sweets really well, played well, all enjoyed Alfie's dancing during our bedtime story and enjoyed the food. I hope your child has shared many happy memories with you and you have seen a growth in their self-confidence. Hopefully this has inspired them to give similar experiences/challenges a go in the future.

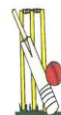
