## The Children's Week



**Class 1** - What an exciting week we have had in Class 1. Our school trip to Magdalen Farm was fantastic. We were very lucky with the weather and although it threatened to rain at several points throughout the day, we only had the odd shower which was just enough to remind us that we were outside. The children took part in several activities including: den building, bug hunting and river dipping. All the children enjoyed themselves and finished the day exhausted (one even fell asleep on the coach).

**Class 2** – This week in Class 2 the children have written, then checked, corrected and improved their final adventures for Traction Man. We have had a week of statistics in Maths, answering questions by collecting, displaying and interpreting data in tally charts, pictograms and block graphs. The highlight though had to be the trip with Class 1 to the Magdalen Farm. From making shelters in the woods, to hot chocolate round the camp fire, hunting for mini beasts and dipping for river creatures; all those involved had a great time (adults as well as children!).



**Class 3** – In Class 3 we had a visit from John Kirk, a storyteller from London. We loved his telling of Streaker, the hundred mile an hour dog by Jeremy Strong, with prompts, including a water pistol. We then completed a drama session where we had to come up with ideas to help Streaker, but unfortunately these ideas caused a few problems. We worked in groups to freeze frame our ideas. We then used our notes from the drama session to write a story in English containing an idea, a problem and a resolution. We also continued to use Charlie and the Chocolate factory to look at punctuating speech and creating suspense. We also had a visit from an Exeter Chiefs, Cornish Pirate Rugby player, who started the 1st of a 5 week session, teaching Maths through Rugby as well as teaching us new Rugby Skills.

**Class 4** – We have had a busy week in class 4 this week. In Maths, we have learned how to measure angles using a protractor as well learning about the different types of angles. The Year 6's have also continued with their SATs Maths revision. In English we wrote our own mystery stories which were full of suspense and tension! The class chose their favourite dish when HALFF came back to school to cook with us on Tuesday. Congratulations to Holly and Grace whose dish 'Spring Chicken Stew' was chosen to go into the final with a chance for the dish to be cooked and served to the public at Axminster Cherry Fayre.
