THE CHILDREN'S WEEK

Class 1 – This week in Class 1 we have looked at postcards; we read 'Meerkat Mail' and 'At the Beach', both of which are written in the style of a post card. We have looked at sharing by reading 'Sharing a Shell' and sharing shells fairly between small groups. We have had two transition activities where our Y1s have spent time in their new classroom and Pre-school children have explored Class 1. We finished the week with a very hot Sports Day.

Class 2 – Lots of hot, sweaty bodies and rather frayed tempers and patience this week in Class 2. Friendships have been tested and the art of compromise well honed. Despite this, some super work has been produced, especially in English, with lovely descriptions of the hero and villain of their story and finally some superb Australian tales being written. Maths has been doubling, halving, multiplication and division. They have daubed some dotty Aboriginal style paintings and tried their hand at rock cave paintings on sandpaper, with some stunning results. There are clearly many budding artists in the class.

Class 3 – In English we have looked at precise verbs and adverbials and used these skills to write correctly punctuated dialogue amongst other characters; a space monkey called Lulu, a dead cat and pentopus. In maths we compared and ordered decimals and fractions and looked at decimal fraction equivalences of a half, one quarter, three quarters etc. We also mapped the settlement of Britain by the Romans, Vikings, Anglo-Saxons and Normans and looked at their influence on the English language.

Class 4 – This week in class 4 we have carried on working on our young entrepreneur projects. The children have written the scripts for their adverts and have started making props. In maths we have been looking at money, budgeting and finance.
