Remember – Online Safety is everybody's responsibility!

Do you know if:

- Your establishment has an up to date Online Safety Policy and does it provide clear guidance to staff and parents on the use of personal devices in the setting?
- Your establishment has a policy for 'acceptable use' which includes 'digital videos and images'?
- Your establishment has a Social Media Policy which provides clear advice on communication with parents and carers?
- Children's use of the internet is physically monitored and supervised?
- Your establishment has a Data Management Policy?
- All staff have an understanding of how data protection laws operate?

Extracts from Ofsted's definition of Safeguarding (Inspecting Safeguarding in early years, education and skills settings 23/8/16):

Safeguarding is not just about protecting children, learners and vulnerable adults from deliberate harm, neglect and failure to act. It relates to broader aspects of care and education, including:

- Online safety and associated issues
- The term 'online safety' reflects a widening range of issues associated with technology and a user's access to content, contact with others and behavioural issues
- Providers must take all necessary steps to keep children safe and well
- Safeguard children
- Manage behaviour
- Maintain records, policies and procedures
